Old Business:

- Shop with a Cop

- Ryan provided an update on the toilets hot water heater – they were fixed the handles were replaced and the flappers were replaced. Daniel Matthews and Shuskey said the female toilets were now hanging up. The man didn't charge for the toilets, but he charged \$3,550 for the water heater.
